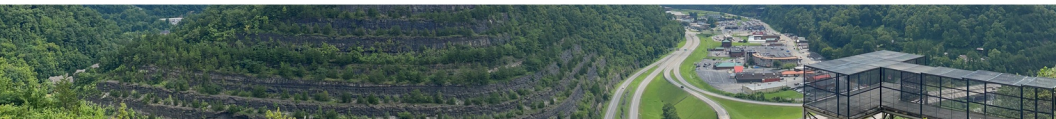

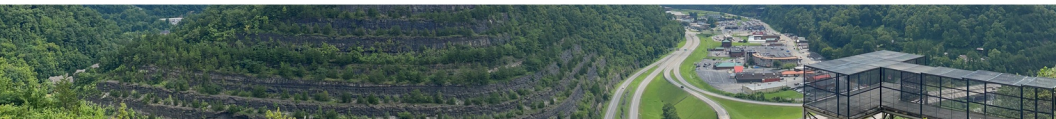
Dueling Barrels Brewery & Distillery/Pearse's Place:

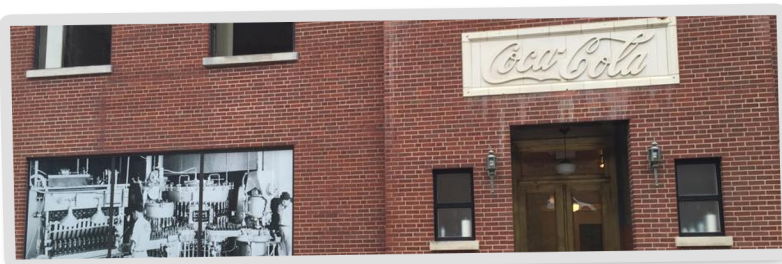

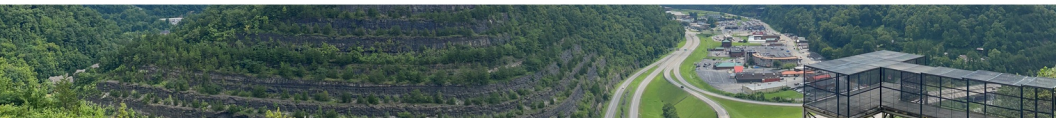
Bit Source:

2nd Street:

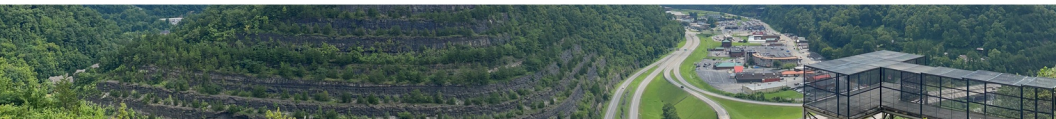
- Downtown Pikeville
- A vibrant shopping and entertainment district including local vendor booths at The Shoppes at 225, The APP, Dueling Barrels, Bank 253 and more
- With a picturesque alleyway decorated seasonally for photos/selfies
- A variety of events including live music, food trucks and themed fun

Academy Building:

- 118 College Street
- On the National Register of Historic Places; built in 1890 with bricks made on-site
- The oldest educational building in Pike County
- Home to the Coleman College of Business and classrooms for the College of Arts & Sciences at UPike, it is the oldest building on UPike's campus

Levisa Fork of the Big Sandy River:

- The Big Sandy is a tributary of the Ohio River and has two forks: the Tug Fork, which flows through Williamson, WV, and the Levisa, which runs through Pikeville. The two forks meet in Louisa, KY
- The Levisa Fork last flooded Pikeville with devastating consequences in 1977
- Pikeville has been protected from river flooding since the installation of floodwalls on both the north and south ends of the city



Pikeville City Park:

- Located at the intersection of College Street and Huffman Avenue
- A popular gathering place with picnic tables, BBQ grills, playground equipment, a statue of former mayor Dr. W.C. Hambley, and a gazebo/shelter area available for private events

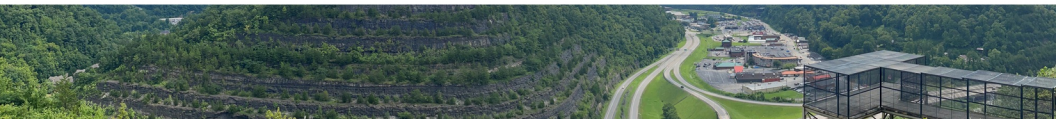
Commercial District:

- Cassady Boulevard
- Popular grocery and big box stores such as Food City, Walmart, and Lowe's
- The Pikeville Commons shopping center includes Hobby Lobby, Marshall's, and Ulta
- Dining options include Drake's, Buffalo Wild Wings, and more
- The Pike County Public Library main branch
- Healthcare including Nordin Eye Center, Pikeville Medical Center Clinics and First Care Urgent Care.



Pikeville Cut-Through:

- Best viewed from Bob Amos Park Overlook
- An astonishing engineering feat deemed the "eighth wonder of the world" by the New York Times.
- Spearheaded by former Mayor William C. Hambley to relieve flooding, the project began in November of 1973 and was completed in 1987
- Relocating the railroad tracks, the river, and 3 major highways relieved congestion and added 390 acres of flat land
- Nearly 18,000,000 cubic yards of dirt and rock were moved, making the Cut-Through the largest land-moving project in the U.S. and the second largest in the Western Hemisphere – ranked second only to the Panama Canal.
- Today, structures located where the river once flowed include Appalachian Wireless Arena, Pike County Health Department, Big Sandy Community & Technical College's Pikeville campus, several Pikeville Medical Center treatment centers, downtown parking, and the Riverfill 10 Cinema

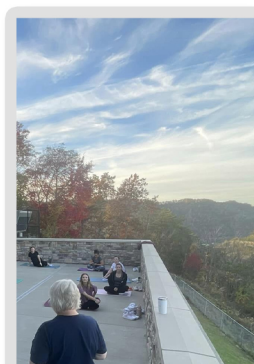


Pauley Bridge:

- North Mayo Trail
- The Pauley Bridge is a suspension bridge crossing the Big Sandy River, connecting North Mayo Trail to the Pauley Addition subdivision
- A Works Progress Administration (WPA) project built during the New Deal, construction was completed in 1940
- The swinging bridge is 380 feet long and was originally designed for car traffic. It was closed to vehicles in 2000 and refurbished for pedestrian and bicycle traffic in 2006
- The only known swinging suspension bridge that uses rough-cut sandstone towers; other bridges of this type use steel towers.
- On the National Register of Historic Places in 1992, often used for prom and wedding photos

Scenic Overlook and Events Center:

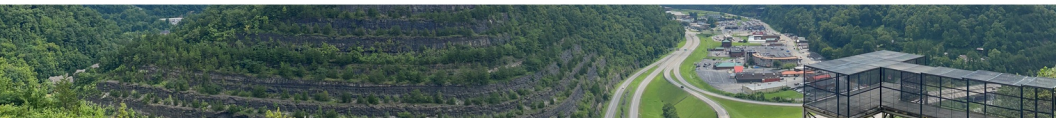
- Bob Amos Drive
- A birds-eye view of downtown Pikeville and the Cut-Through project
- The Overlook Events Center, a 350-person event venue is available for private parties and sometimes used for city events



The 99:

- Hambley Boulevard, downtown Pikeville
- The historic 99 steps lead from the UPike campus to downtown Pikeville, representing students' path to success
- Each fall before classes begin, incoming freshmen ascend "the 99" as a group during a tradition known as "The Climb"
- At their base is a statue of former Kentucky Governor and UPike Chancellor Paul Patton





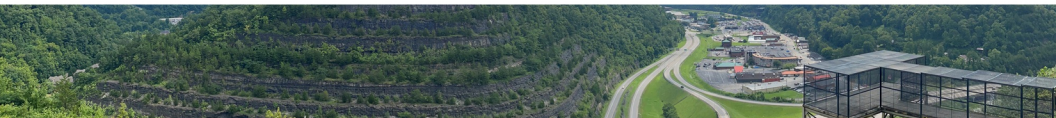
York House:

- Main Street
- A historic home designed by Augusta Dils York and built around 1876 by her father, Colonel John Dils, a well-known businessman and abolitionist
- The Yorks' neighbor was Perry Cline, a local attorney and prominent figure in the Hatfield-McCoy feud, whose legal guardian as a child was Colonel Dils. Cline was the McCoy's lawyer
- Augusta's husband John York was the Hatfields' lawyer
- York, Cline, and McCoy patriarch Randolph met daily in the parlor of the York home to negotiate. The two lawyers helped broker a deal between the Hatfields and McCoy's to end the decades-long feud
- On the National Register of Historic Places, the home is notable for its Italianate architecture and status as the oldest unaltered residence in Pikeville



Faith:

- Pikeville offers numerous churches for several Christian denominations (as well as non-denominational.) Some of Pikeville's most popular churches include Pikeville United Methodist on Main Street; First Baptist Church on 4th Street; and the nondenominational Connection Church on South Mayo Trail. Other options include Main Street Church of Christ, Pikeville Wesleyan Church, St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church, First Presbyterian Church, Cornerstone Christian Church, and New Beginnings Fellowship Church.
- For followers of Islam, there is a Mosque located in nearby Prestonsburg (a 30 minute drive) the Islamic Center of Eastern Kentucky
